



Safety Guidance for Reopening & Maintaining Manufacturing Facilities During COVID-19

This collection of safety-related resources is intended to support Ohio manufacturers as they reopen facilities or continue essential operations during the COVID-19 outbreak. Overview

When Gov. Mike DeWine outlined Ohio's "Path Forward to Restart" on April 17, 2020, he mentioned the following best practices, which have been used at essential businesses that continued to operate during the stay-at-home order:

- Distancing; ("The more, the better.")
- Use of masks;
- Use of gloves;
- Use of barriers;
- Frequent hand-washing and sanitizing;
- Frequent disinfecting of surfaces;
- Staggered shifts and lunches;
- Health checks of employees when they arrive at work;
- Working remotely when possible; and
- Limiting number of occupants in confined areas (both customers and employees).
